Demand for Growth: Migration Mega-trend: One in Seven

7 billion Population

1 billion Migrants



214 million International

740 million Internal

Urbanization: 50%

Feminization: ca. 50%

International migration: faster growth than in past 25 yrs

Migration Drivers Increase Complexity

- I. DEMOGRAPHY: North ageing, South youthful
- 2. DEMAND labour shortage vs. labour surplus
- 3. DISPARITY increasing: economic, social
- 4. DISTANCE shrinking: budget transportation
- 5. DIGITAL REVOLUTION: instant information
- 6. DISASTERS: natural & human-made, rapid & slow onset
- 7. DREAMS: life with dignity and prosperity.

Effective crisis response requires contextualized solutions

Complex causes

- Man made or natural disaster
- Civil unrest, clashing ethnic groups, environmental challenges

Crisis in one country

- Jeopardized livelihoods
- Mobility in the region and beyond
- Disrupted trade and labour channels

Not just emergency response - Safe & orderly migration through sustainable approaches

<u>Added Value – (I) Analytical:</u>

- Vulnerable groups identified
 - Migrant workers, irregular migrants, trafficking victims
- Shared vocabulary and analysis
 - Clear communication

Added Value - (2) Operational:

- Enhanced coordination: no duplication
- Increased effectiveness: specific role s
- Displacement Tracking Matrix
- – mapping, assistance, targeting, monitoring, evaluation

Added Value - Results (1):

- Reinforced partnerships Identified vital areas
 - E.g., OCHA-led cluster, UNHCR
 - From peace and security to broad development framework

Clear partnerships - Supports Transformative Agenda

Added Value – Results (2):

- Support to states
 - Protection of human rights
 - Migration: from crisis reponse to tool for development
- Sustainable recovery
 - migration development nexus
 - HLD and post-2015 development agenda
