Key messages from Asian FBO round table discussion

Background:

The Asian Round Table Dialogue for Faith Based Organizations and Religious Leaders in Humanitarian Action is aimed at having a platform for dialogue to integrate the activities of FBOs in the larger humanitarian architecture for better understanding and agreement in effective humanitarian response. Main objectives of the discussions were;

- To discuss the role of faith based response with particular attention to the humanitarian principles of humanity, neutrality, impartiality and independence.
- To discuss issues surrounding a community based approach to humanitarian response
- To create a platform for Asian Faith Based Organizations and Religious Leaders to co-ordinate and collaborate their work

The discussion was very fruitful and following organisations participated in round table discussions:

Key messages for WHS:

- Asserts that faith based organizations are key actors in humanitarian response based on various examples from emergencies from Asian region
- *Establishes* that faith based organizations act in keeping with humanitarian principles of humanitarianism with special attention to humanity, neutrality, impartiality and independence
- *Recommends* that humanitarianism needs to be guided by faith based principles such as love, spirituality, morality and culture
- *Recognizes* that local and political dynamics are different in different context and a nuanced approach can improve regional co-operation in humanitarian response
- *Observes* that there is a distinction between faith actors and faith leaders in mobilizing support and political action during emergencies
- Improves accountability and evidence for action that is based on humanitarian standards.
- *Calls upon* the international community to help establish an interfaith network that is accountable, neutral and effective in the Asian region which can be anchored by regional networks like ADRRN

• *FBOs* are critical for localizing response which is one of the key recommendation from the region and strong partnership is needed between FBOs and humanitarian organizations for effective response
