Biography

Prof Jean Allain is the leading legal scholar on issues of human trafficking and modern slavery and Special Adviser to Anti-Slavery International, the world's oldest international human rights organisation.

Prof Allain is also Professor of International Law with the Wilberforce Institute for the study of Slavery and Emancipation (WISE) at the University of Hull, UK.

Prof Allain holds a Doctorate from the Graduate Institute for International Studies, University of Geneva; during his graduate studies he clerked for the first President of the International Criminal Tribunal for the former Yugoslavia.

Prof Allain is also Extraordinary Professor, Centre for Human Rights, University of Pretoria, South Africa; and Visiting Professor, Beijing Normal University (2017–2020).
