


76% of detected victims of trafficking in persons are females.

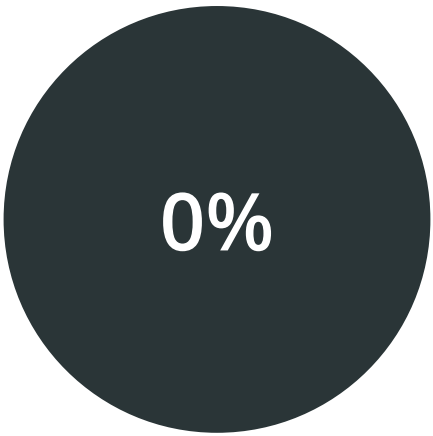
15% of detected victims of trafficking in persons are children.
